(re 1:1) so begins the book of revelation, one of the most challenging books in the bible. it is the first book that many new to the bible want to study, while it is often neglected by mature

the complete book of revelation - words of truth - studies in the book of revelation chapter one 1:1 "the revelation of jesus christ, which god gave unto him, to shew unto his servants things which must shortly come to pass; and he sent and signified it by his angel unto his servant john."
